

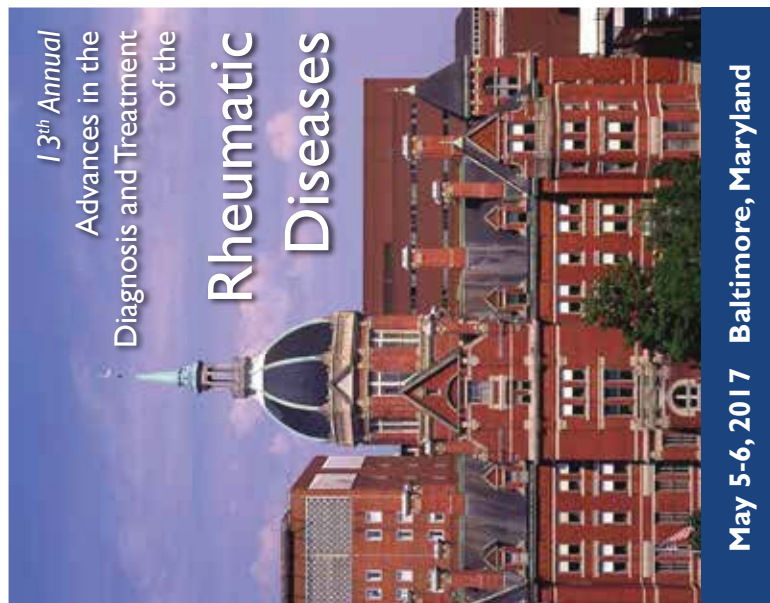

Description

Now in its 13th year, this two-day symposium has been planned for the providers who care for patients with rheumatic disease. Given the wide variety of rheumatologic disorders, and an ever-increasing number of diagnostic procedures and treatment options, it is necessary to provide clinicians with information about strategies for the early diagnosis of these conditions, novel state-of-the-art diagnostic tools, and opportunities to utilize the most effective treatments to ensure optimal patient outcomes.

Who Should Attend

This activity is intended for rheumatologists, internists, gerontologists, orthopedic surgeons, nurses and other allied health professionals involved in the care of patients with rheumatic diseases.

Objectives

After attending this activity, the participant will demonstrate the ability to:

- Discuss updates in the treatment of rheumatoid arthritis.
- Appreciate new treatment options for patients with psoriatic arthritis.
- Discuss new and emerging issues in the management of inflammatory eye disease.
- Identify major issues related to the management of vasculitis.
- Recognize the major dermatologic manifestations of psoriatic arthritis.
- Discuss treatment strategies in systemic lupus erythematosus.
- Discuss basic immunology and its role in auto-immune diseases.
